Abstract

We consider language thinking as a process of making sense of the world by creative individuals using verbal means and the system of conceptual dominants important for a certain stage of cognition. On the basis of modern fiction, we reveal the leading ideas of Ukrainian writers' worldview, model the constants of Ukrainian culture, analyze the dynamics of national consciousness and language development.

We describe the modern methodology of systematizing the means of artis-tic and figurative understanding of reality (epithets, similes, metaphors) and their reproduction in the latest explanatory dictionaries – the one-volume "Dic-tionary of Ukrainian Creative Personalities' Language of the Second Half of the 20th – Beginning of the 21st Century" (2022) and the four-volume "Explanatory Dictionary of the Ukrainian Language of the Active Type" which is currently being worked on by lexicographers of the Institute for the Ukrainian Language of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine under the leadership of Evgeniia Karpilovska.

We trace the peculiarities of the functional and stylistic load of units of the language lexical core and their active use in modern fiction. Using the ex-ample of the word брама (gate), we analyze the methods of systematic lexico-graphic reproduction of the development of the word semantic structure and strengthening of its functioning in modern active speech. We model the interac-tion of language and social development, express the national specificity of the artistic and figurative means of the modern language. We include in the analysis the best examples of language creation by Lina Kostenko, Vasyl Shkliar, Nadiia Humeniuk, Volodymyr Lys, Mariia Matios, Iryna Savka, Zirka Menzatiuk, Dmytro Cherednychenko, Halyna Vdovychenko, Dara Korniy, Nika Nikaleo, Lesia Voronyna, Svitlana Talan, Tetiana Belimova, Max Kidruk, Andriy Kokotiukha and other writers, and we also analyze the language of modern artistic translation.

We emphasize the durability of national and linguistic traditions and highlight the importance of universal human cultural values for the harmonious development of language and society in the era of global changes.
