

# **Representation of the aspectual paradigm of a verb in different types of dictionaries**

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## **Abstract**

The article discusses the concept of an aspectual paradigm as a fragment of the word-forming paradigm of a basic (non-derivative within the verb) verb, which is formed by the members of its verb block. It is noted that all members of the aspectual paradigm belong to a certain actionsart and can indicate the beginning, completion, time limit or one-time manifestation of the action called by the base verb. Different types of dictionaries should be oriented towards certain rules of presentation of members of the aspectual paradigm – derived verbs with aspectually marked meanings. For a universal explanatory dictionary, it is enough to fix aspectual pairs (suffix, prefix, suppletive) and widely use standard formulas for the interpretation of verbs belonging to a certain actionsart. In the interpretation of phraseological units, aspectual modifications of verbs should be consistently considered as variants of phraseological units. In educational dictionaries, it is advisable to present the aspectual paradigms of basic verbs as widely as possible.
